

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. INTRODUCTION

With a large membership, it is important to ensure that the use of Mont Choisy Le Golf (the Club) facilities are set within guidelines understood by all for the benefit of all. The purpose of these rules is to provide members, guests and visitors with a guide for the friendly sharing of these facilities.

These rules are not intended to create a bureaucratic, regulatory environment, but rather, to promote and ensure our Club Values. Each section in these rules is designed to promote honesty, civility and equality and to serve as a constant reminder to members, guests and visitors to show due consideration to their fellow members and golfers when sharing in our Club facilities.

These rules have been developed to ensure a safe, friendly and respectful place for members, visitors, staff and management to gather in the spirit of cooperation, relaxation, good will, fun and friendly competition and these rules are recommended for your reading.

2. PRINCIPLES

The Club shall, in carrying out its objectives and in all its activities and functions at all levels:

2.1 Observe the principles that:

- 2.1.1. The game should be played, administered and promoted in a fair and responsible manner.
- 2.1.2 Subject to the provisions of the membership agreement, all persons, should have the right, in whatever capacity, to participate in the game and activities of the game at the Club and forbid any form of discrimination based on race, colour, creed or gender.

3. CLUBHOUSE AND SURROUNDS

- 3.1 The Clubhouse opens and closes daily at such hours as may be determined by Management. The use of any portion of the Club premises may, at the discretion of the General Manager, be closed to members, guests and visitors for functions and/or private events.
- 3.2 In keeping with the vision of the Club to offer its members fun and relaxation with family and friends, children are welcome. Parents or custodians are requested ensure that their children adhere to Club Rules with children under the age of 12 being supervised by guardians at all times.

- 3.3 Members, guests and visitors should dress in a manner befitting a Club of our standing. Inappropriate dress shows a lack of courtesy to fellow members. The general rule is smart casual, appropriate to the occasion and time of day.
- 3.4 Members should carry their membership cards with them when visiting and utilising the club, as proof of membership may be called upon from time to time by staff or management.

4. GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT FOR MEMBERS, GUESTS AND VISITORS

All members, guests and visitors are expected to conduct themselves in a matter that:

- 4.1 Creates an environment and culture that is reflective of the personal integrity and respect taught in the rules of golf where it is written that we are capable of enforcing rules upon ourselves with honesty, integrity and good sportsmanship. This same integrity, honesty and good sportsmanship are expected whether on the golf Course or using any of the Club's other amenities.
- 4.2 Acknowledges that the Club is a family environment and, therefore, refrain from using obscenities and loud boisterous behaviour inappropriate for children and good taste.
- 4.3 Observes proper etiquette on and off the course and in the Club house.
- 4.4 Shows the utmost respect and dignity to fellow members, staff and visitors.
- 4.5 Does not damage the character, integrity, good will and property of the Club and/or staff.
- 4.6 Is reflective of an adherence to all Club rules.
- 4.7 Demonstrates an understanding that members and visitors have no authority to instruct staff in job performance and duties and this responsibility lies with the General Manager or Duty Manager.
- 4.8 Does not denigrate, talk down to, scream at staff members, general membership and/or Guests and does not create unnecessary strife and divisiveness.

The following conduct should always be adhered to:

- 4.9 The discreet use of cell phones is permitted on the Club premises if exercised in good manners and consideration to fellow patrons.
- 4.10 Any business transacted at the Club should be done discreetly and in a manner that does not interfere with the sport and leisure activities of others.

- 4.11 Members, guests or visitors should not remove any club items such as towels, glassware, plants or any other articles from the Club premises.
- 4.12 Players are requested to store their property (in particular, sport equipment and sport bags) in designated storage areas. Sport bags should not be brought into the bar or restaurant areas.
- 4.13 It is not permitted to remove food (except for officially ordered and paid for take-away meals) or beverages from the Club premises, nor will members be permitted to bring their own food or beverages for consumption in the Club house.
- 4.14 The primary responsibility of the Club employees is to provide excellent service to the members, guests and visitors and it is imperative that they be treated with utmost courtesy and respect at all times.
- 4.15 Without the prior permission of the General Manager no member may introduce anyone as a guest whose presence, in the opinion of the General Manager or Management, is undesirable, or who has been rejected as a member or suspended or expelled from membership of the Club.
- 4.16 Members may introduce guests who are entitled to remain on the Club premises only while the introducing member is also on the premises.
- 4.17 A member may not introduce more than 24 guests in a calendar year and may not introduce the same guest more than twice in any calendar month, without prior arrangement with the General Manager.
- 4.18 Members are responsible for ensuring that their guests comply with the club rules and are personally liable for all expenses incurred by their guests at the Club.

5. DRESS CODE FOR ALL PLAYERS

The Club expects visitors to respect the same dress code as members and the following will be considered the minimum standard permitted:

- 5.1 The wearing of denims, jeans, tee-shirts, non-tailored shorts and non-closed shoes is not permitted on the Course at any time.
- 5.2 Footwear must be worn in the Clubhouse and on the Course at all times.
- 5.3 Shirts must be generally recognised golfing attire and be tucked into the waistband at all time.
- 5.4 Headgear must be worn with peak facing forward and may not be worn in the Clubhouse.

- 5.5 All users of Club facilities are expected to co-operate in maintaining Clubhouse standards and members are responsible for ensuring that their guests conform to all dress, etiquette and discipline requirements of the Club.
- 5.6 Members, guests and visitors are expected to be always dressed neatly and tidily. Management of the Club have the authority to require members or visitors to change unsuitable clothing or leave the Course or Clubhouse facility in inappropriately dressed.

6. USE OF THE GOLF COURSE

- 6.1 The Management may reserve the course for any particular competition, corporate or sponsored day and may impose restrictions on the use of either course or practice areas from time to time.
- 6.2 The latest rules of the R&A shall apply, subject to such local rules as Management may decide. On days when the course has been reserved for official club competitions, members who have reserved tee-off times are obliged to participate in the competition. The Management decides on the handicap limit for all competitions.
- 6.3 A full name must be entered on the time sheet for every individual on whose behalf a tee-off time is reserved, failing which the reservation will not be valid and the individual tee-off time will be released. If any properly reserved tee-off time is not cancelled at least 48 hours beforehand or the players are a 'no show', the member(s) whose account number(s) have been entered on the time sheet become liable for the green fee and their account(s) will be debited accordingly.
- 6.4 Prior to the commencement of play, all players are to report and register with guest services and to pay the applicable green fee and/or competition fee and obtain a receipt. Players are requested to report to the starter at least 5min prior to their scheduled tee off time. The Starter may request proof of receipt prior to teeing off. The course marshal or any other club official may at any time request a player to produce such receipt, where upon such request the member is to oblige. The starter is also authorised by the Club to enforce the golfing dress code of golfers before teeing off.
- 6.5 Players lose their tee-off time if they are late for their official starting tee. Their tee-off shall then be at the discretion of the starter and may result in players being required to play at the end of the field. Play may only start on either the first or the 10th tees or on a hole officially assigned by Management.
- 6.6 Golf is a sport played outdoors and is subject to weather conditions. If the course or practice range is closed by management due to inclement weather, play will be suspended and efforts made to reschedule. Refunds are only offered if play is

cancelled by management before tee-off and no rescheduling is possible. No refunds will be provided if players voluntarily abandon their round.

- 6.7 The club has a limited number of golf carts that is provided inclusive of the green fee charge. No person is permitted to bring any other private cart, three or four-wheeled driveable golf cart onto the golf course.
- 6.8 No person under 18 years of age may operate a golf cart on club property. Golf carts must be driven with care and caution to avoid damage and collisions especially at intersections and crossways. Cart directional signage must always be adhered to and it is encouraged to use the golf cart pathways provided at all possible times.
- 6.9 Practice may only take place in areas demarcated for such purpose. Practising on the course is not permitted.
- 6.10 Players are requested to have due consideration for all other players who use our golf course. In every grouping of players, the lowest handicap player is responsible for preventing slow play. The course marshal has been designated to right to enforce a good pace of play.
- 6.11 The club requests that players are conscientious about raking bunkers, repairing pitch marks, filling in divots and leaving the course in the same or better condition than they found it.

7. COMPETITIONS

Management will from time-to-time schedule and host various tournaments and competitions for the enjoyment of the members and their guests which is to be played under a set of rules as set by Management for the specific event. The following is noted:

- 7.1 Only golfer's holding official golf handicaps may participate in club competitions and be eligible for prizes. The Management has the discretion to determine the handicap of a person competing in a club competition who is not handicapped at the club. Junior members may request permission with the General Manager to participate in club competitions. Only fully paid-up club members in good standing may compete in the Club Championships and other such 'members only' competitions as set by Management.
- 7.2 To facilitate the calculation of competition results, players are expected to hand in scorecards as soon as they completed their rounds. Failure to hand in a scorecard within 10 minutes after completion of the round may at the discretion of management result in disqualification.

- 7.3 As a courtesy to sponsors and other competitors, players should always strive to attend prize giving, especially those members who have won prizes. Players who win prizes and who do not attend prize giving without appropriate apology to management, or who persistently fail to attend prize giving may, at the discretion of the General Manager, have their prizes declared forfeited. Non-attendance by an individual competitor (or by at least one member of a team) may, at the discretion of the General Manager, result in the automatic loss of any count out if the opponent (or a least one member of the opposing team) is present. During prize giving the venue falls under the General Manager and members should respect his requirements regarding bar service, music, noise and television broadcasts.

8. RIGHT OF ADMISSION, DISCLAIMER AND LIABILITY

Management reserves the right of admission and the right to remove any person whose behavior is unacceptable to either other guests or staff and/or is failing to abide by the rules and etiquette regulations.

All persons who enter Mont Choisy Le Golf (MCLG) property or who utilize the facilities of the MCLG and participate in any of the activities of MCLG do so at their own risk. MCLG, it's agents, employees and directors shall not be liable for any claims of any nature however arising. All persons hereby indemnify the MCLG against all and any claims which may arise.
